- o Genre of academic journals
 - o Number of journals 22,000
 - o Refereed
 - o Blind review
 - o Volume number and issues, page numbering
 - o Editorial Board
 - o Theme issues
 - o Book reviews (good entry point to publishing)

What you need to DO- 1

- o 4. Join a professional association.
- o 5. Check out the exhibits at big conferences.
- o 6. Search electronic databases.
- o 7. Use a variety of keywords in searches.

What you need to DO- 3

- o Evaluate academic journals for YOUR work!
 - o Identify
 - o Stretch
 - o Reach
 - o Fall back journals....
 - o Do Text-Structure Analysis of 3 articles
 - o Look for patterns
 - o Match your manuscript to common patterns

What you need to do- 4

- o Write that Query Letter to
- o Managing editor:
 - o Nuts and bolts stuff
- o Executive (faculty) editor:
 - o Keep it short
 - o State why your work is worthwhile
 - o Display knowledge of journal
 - o Give title of article and abstract and length
 - o Ask a question that will tease out possible rejection
 - o “I am concerned about whether the qualitative method...”
 - o Thank the editor
